NAME OF WINNER:

ENTERPRISE SOUTH NATURE PARK

TYPE OF AWARD:

REGIONAL PUBLIC PARK

DESCRIPTION:

The Enterprise Center Nature Park is a unique 2,300 acre facility offering patrons 5.3 miles of woodland walking/hiking trails, 10 miles of mountain bike trails, 6.9 miles of paved walking and bike roads, a 7 mile driving loop, a 1 mile ADA accessible woodland trail, 3 historic exhibits, and 4 picnic areas. Formerly a federal munition storage facility, this beautiful park offers a plethora of recreational opportunities and allows visitors to tailor their activities to their individual interests and to their desired distance of travel within the facility.

AWARD WINNING FEATURES:

- The design and construction of the park and the building were planned to coexist seamlessly with the natural beauty of the property.
- The park contains a trail that connects the neighboring Volkswagen complex with the park.
- Provides a vital recreation and geo-tourism component to the region.
- Partnership for proper design and construction of the mountain biking trail system was formed between Hamilton County Parks and Recreation and the Southern Off-Road Biking Association.
- The user disciplines are separated for transportation safety and convenience of all park patrons.

TRANSPORTATION ASPECTS:

Motorized traffic is only allowed on the facility's perimeter road.

- Off-road bicyclists have ten miles of dedicated trail.
- Road cyclists have more than six miles of paved trail to be shared with pedestrians.
- Pedestrians have singular access to more than five miles of strictly walking/hiking trails.

ENERGY/GREEN ASPECTS:

- Waste reduction is key element in the construction and maintenance of the Park.
- Recycling downed trees and brush into mulch for trails.
- Great care was taken to not disturb the natural environment during the construction.
- Revitalize former munition storage facility for walking/hiking, running, bicycling and public use.
