**ITEM #4. APPROVE BY RESOLUTION NATIONAL HIGHWAY SYSTEM GAP REVISION AND FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM OF STREETS REVISION (TN)**

<b>DISCUSSION</b>		
Ms. Aleeta Zeller said that this is a two-part Resolution to change the functional classification of SR 317 (Bonny Oaks / Apison Pike) to Urban Principal Arterial, and then add it to the National Highway System (NHS). Currently, this is a "gap" in the NHS and TDOT has requested that the gap be filled.		
Responding to inquiries regarding a gap and the impact of this reclassification, Ms. Melissa Taylor said that funding at the federal level relates to functional classifications of the system. There is a different fund of money available and consideration given for actual Interstate and NHS routes. This change would make the particular portion of the system outlined eligible for additional funding consideration. It would still remain a state route but would then be on the NHS.		
A map indicating the proposed changes was included in the meeting packet which Ms. Zeller explained in detail responding to questions regarding the change area.		

Ms. Zeller called for further questions or comments, and there being none, Chairman Colby called for a motion to approve as presented.

**ITEM #5. ENDORSEMENT BY THE TPO TECHNICAL COORDINATING COMMITTEE AND EXECUTIVE BOARD OF 2013 TENNESSEE STATEWIDE MULTIMODAL ACCESS FUND PROJECTS**

**DISCUSSION**

Ms. Jenny Park said that TDOT opened up the first round of applications for the 2013-2014 Multimodal Access Fund in October 2013. This is a new state-funded program requiring a 5% local match for bicycle, pedestrian and transit projects, and the TPO may submit two projects to TDOT for potential funding (\$1M maximum each project). Three project applications were received which were detailed by Ms. Park (one from the Town of Signal Mountain and two from the City of Chattanooga). A Selection Committee meeting was held by TPO Staff on December 9, 2013 to determine which two projects would be submitted. Ms. Park detailed the makeup of the Selection Committee and stated that the two projects receiving the highest points were: (1) Broad Street Protected Bike Lanes, and (2) Virginia Avenue Neighborhood Greenway (both City of Chattanooga projects). The Taft Highway project (Town of Signal Mountain) is already funded in the 2014-2017 TIP with STP-M (requiring a 20% local match), and TPO Staff is not recommending this project for submittal for the 2013-2014 Multimodal Access Funds. The two City of Chattanooga projects being submitted have no other funding source.

Ms. Park called for questions or comments, and after her clarification of the funding source for the Town of Signal Mountain project, Chairman Colby called for a motion to approve as presented.

**ITEM #6. PRESENTATION – FINAL DRAFT OF THE 2040 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN AND CONFORMITY DETERMINATION REPORT FOR THE 2040 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN**

**DISCUSSION**

Ms. Melissa Taylor said that, after two years, the end of the work is nearing on the 2040 Regional Transportation Plan and Conformity Determination Report for the 2040 Regional Transportation Plan, and that this is the final review of the documents with the TPO before they come before the TPO Technical Coordinating Committee for recommendation and Executive Board for approval on January 7, 2014. Ms. Taylor then reviewed major steps which have been taken to develop the plan. She said that almost 20 jurisdictions were involved and that a lot of economic development (and potential development) exists. She recapped the funding challenges (being impacted by less funding). Ms. Taylor said that the plan shifts to a much more integrated network in order to recognize deficiencies and seeks to improve them over time. To address issues and think about how multimodal projects should work together, a huge public participation effort was undertaken including two Leadership Symposiums, asset management data collection and analysis, and detailed public survey resulting in many new participants in the process. In summary, there were 31 total outreach events/activities equating to 932 interactions with the community, resulting in the awareness of a vast array of needs and interests within the region. The packet contained an RTP highlight sheet, federal comments and TPO Staff responses to the federal comments.

Ms. Tracy Selin, Cambridge Systematics, Inc., recapped how the information gathered by the RTP Team was used to ensure a balanced approach to evaluating projects and address competing needs (local or community investment or regional top-down perspectives - sometimes at odds with each other). Ms. Selin said that, through the new Community to Region framework, the plan attempts to minimize the conflict between the two perspectives (treating them both fairly), and that the technical elements of the performance based planning approach (under MAP-21) have been presented to the TPO in the past. She said that breaking up the typical goals and objectives exercise into three geographic areas (Within Community, Community to Region, and Region to Region) to evaluate projects and address needs in different ways provided more context in the evaluation process. The organizing framework resulted in the goals and objectives for each of the scales and project selection criteria (modified weights of each scale based on benefits), and alignment with the national transportation goals under MAP-21. This process resulted in a better blend of different types of investments throughout the region with the TPO being allowed to focus on the list of priorities based on the project ranking before funding entered the picture, ensuring that priorities were addressed first with funding sources and then being defined. Ms. Selin said that the plan is well below the emissions limits, it meets the federal transportation air quality requirements, and that this is very important.

Ms. Selin said that the plan doubled the amount of system maintenance funding over what she has seen in the Chattanooga region in the past, and this is another important element of MAP-21 (maintaining the system before adding new). She said that there is a doubling of funding for bike/ped improvements, and there are some strategic roadway and transit expansion improvements (including the Chattanooga Way study), a 19-mile Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) line, and identification of some safety and system operations set aside funds. Using the TIP process, the TPO will ensure that projects are funded through those lump sums that are consistent with the RTP lump sum set asides.

Ms. Taylor said that the TPO is doing a great job of working projects into the TIP process/pipeline. She said that, while she is not an expert in the area of Bus Rapid Transit, a study is being conducted with CARTA to determine the type of facility and possible route improvements which may be needed in the region to address some of these types of services.

Ms. Taylor agreed that "fix it first" is very important, it is a priority to the people of this region, and that land use has a large relationship to how the system works and responds to needs and growth. The RPA is reevaluating the current Comprehensive Plan and considering land use planning moving forward and how it relates to the transportation process. Responding to an inquiry, Ms. Taylor said that the 2040 RTP documents will come before the TPO TCC for recommendation on January 7, 2014 and before the TPO Executive Board for approval that afternoon. She called for further questions or comments and there were none.

The packet contained the web address for the draft 2014 RTP and CDR for the 2040 RTP. Ms. Karen Rennich recognized Mr. Peter Haliburton of Cambridge Systematics, Inc. who was present at the meeting.
